**Do not worry about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. Philippians 4:6**

Q: What is the best way to develop a relationship with someone?

A: To spend quality time and honest, meaningful conversation with them.

So why is it that we do not take the same approach with God?

How much time in a day do you actually spend with God?  
How much time do you spend in honest, meaningful conversation with God?

Prayer is our opportunity to spend time with God.  
Prayer is our chance to engage in honest, meaningful conversation with God.

Unfortunately, we do not always take full advantage of this opportunity.  
God has offered us full, uninterrupted access, but often we end up being too busy or too tired to appreciate and utilize the gift.

Unfortunately, when we do make time for prayer, we often fail to share with God in an authentic and meaningful way.

We end up censoring ourselves and praying for the things that we think are “appropriate”. Too often we hide our deepest emotions and feelings from God in order to be on our best behavior.

But why do we do that?  
The reality is that God already knows what we are thinking and feeling, and God has promised not to hold those feelings against us. It is only by sharing our thoughts and feelings honestly with God that our relationship can begin to grow. It is through honest conversation that God can “meet us where we are” and help us to grow as God’s people.

If you do not presently have a “prayer discipline”, consider structuring intentional time in your day for prayer; both speaking to and listening to God. If you do presently pray, consider growing in your prayer life through expanding the ways in which you share your feelings and emotions with God.

And take heart.....The Apostle Paul tells us in Romans 8, that when we do not know how to pray as we ought, the Holy Spirit reaches out and communicates to God for us even if it is with sighs and groans too deep for words.

God is always reaching out to you. May you become more and more aware of God’s loving presence as you grow in Christ’s grace and love.

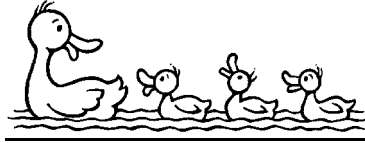
## **Cystic Fibrosis Great Strides - Walking for Patty**

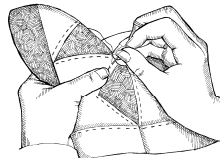

### **Red Cross Homeless Shelter**

Bill Burns, the Director of the Red Cross Homeless Shelter, wanted to extend his deepest gratitude for all of the Easter Baskets that we brought to the kids at the shelter. They were truly thankful for our contribution. When we dropped off the baskets, Woody and I were able to look around the shelter and talk to some of the employees. Due to the economy, there has been a shortage of basic needs that these families really need. When we were there, they only had 2 blankets left. They gave us a wish list with some basic items that are needed. If you are able to donate anything, I know that they would really appreciate it. Items that they are in need of include: sheets (single and twin), pillow cases, towels, washcloths, blankets, liquid Lysol, Windex, rubber gloves (large and X-large), trash bags (small kitchen and large 55 gallon), paper towels. Also, gas/gift cards are needed. Each week, their van is driven more than 500 miles to transport residents to work, medical appointments, job interviews, field trips for the kids and other activities. It is a vital part of their operation. The gift cards are held by the shelter and they go out and buy things that are needed when an emergency arises (ex: a toddler with a cold who needs Tylenol, a guy who needs steel toed boots when starting a new job, light bulbs that blow out). The best stores to meet their needs are: Walmart, K Mart, Target, Lowes and Home Depot. If you can donate anything, please give it to Woody or Audrey Woodward and they will drop the items off, or you can take any items directly to the shelter. # GOOD NEWS T-SHIRT

Jesus told his disciples — and us — to go into all the world and preach the good news. Wherever you go, this cool T-shirt will help spark conversations about your faith.

**What you need:**

- Newspaper
- Cardboard
- Plain white, cotton T-shirt
- Permanent markers
- Goggles (optional)
- Eye dropper
- Rubbing alcohol
- Clothes hanger

**What you do:**

1. Cover a table with newspaper. (Work outside or in a well-ventilated area.)
2. Place a piece of cardboard inside your T-shirt. (This keeps pen marks from going through to the other side.)
3. With permanent markers, draw a design of large circles, spirals, hearts, etc.
4. Wear goggles while dropping rubbing alcohol onto your designs with an eye dropper. As the alcohol permeates the permanent marker, the color will break up and spread in interesting ways.
5. Hang the shirt to dry.
6. When the shirt is dry, place cardboard inside it again. On the front, write "I have some good news to share with you." You can also write a Bible verse.
