National Youth Gathering in New Orleans

What 37,000 youth accomplished in 3 days in July of 2009 would have taken the city of New Orleans another 3-4 years to complete...

After hurricane Katrina slammed into the Gulf Coast wreaking havoc on the city of New Orleans, ELCA members rolled up their sleeves and helped with the heavy lifting. In 2009 37,000 ELCA young people showed up in New Orleans ready to help rebuild a struggling city. And rebuild, they did. They completed service projects-painted, took out trash, raked, cleaned and made repairs. There was a lot of physical work to be done. BUT, above all of that, they made human connections. They learned about hospitality and how people overcame tragedy with an unwavering faith. They began a journey that travels far beyond service projects with the residents of New Orleans. That's why we're going back. To continue the good work and learn about the new house God is building, "a holy temple in the Lord; in whom you also are built together spiritually into a dwelling place for God." 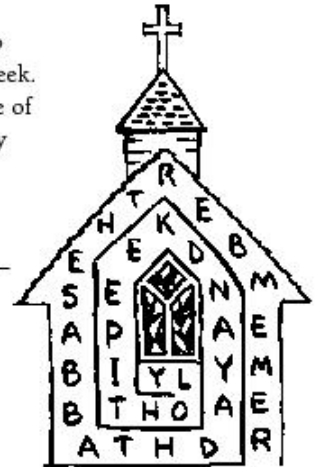
